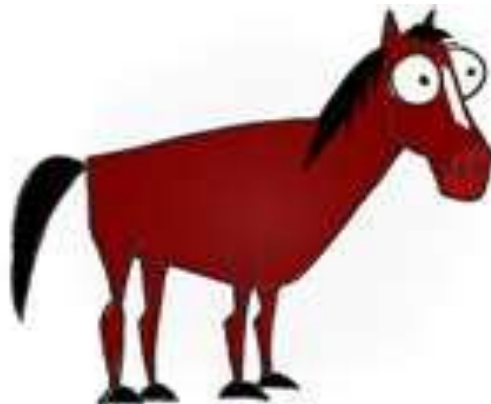
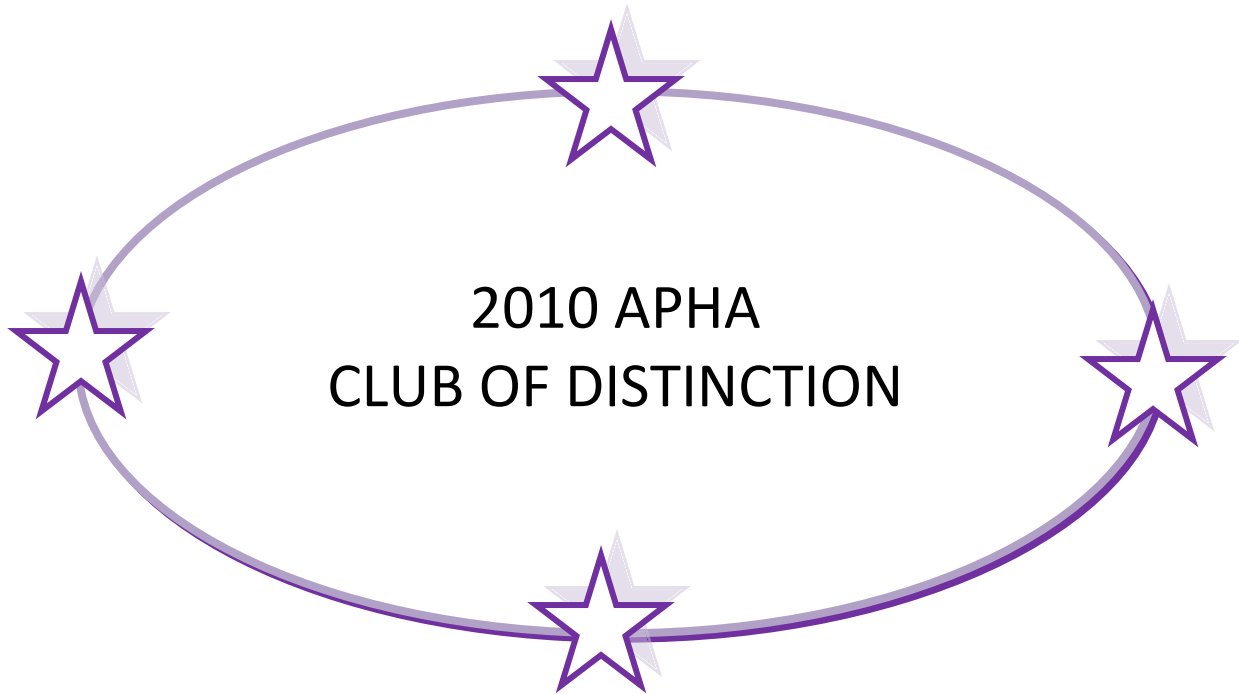

## Young Equestrians Shine at AjPHA Youth Worlds



The dust has settled on the 2011 American Junior Paint Horse Association's (AjPHA) Youth World Championship Paint Horse Show, which was held June 24 – July 2, 2011 in Fort Worth, Texas at Will Rogers Memorial Center.

The AjPHA Youth World Show showcased the talent of both the Paint Horse breed and the young people who exhibit them with 73 world-title classes in a full array of disciplines, in addition to a handful of assorted other classes specifically for the youth competitors. Youth are classified as competitors ages 18 and under who are required to show a horse they own personally or owned by a family member.

In all, both the breed and the upcoming generation were well represented by 326 horses and 1,150 entries during the course of the nine days' worth of activities where the Association presented over \$100,000 in cash and prizes. World and Reserve World Champions received Gist trophy buckles, and top ten finishers received a variety of other valuable prizes from sponsors and APHA. Total payout in the six jackpot classes offered (barrel racing, pole bending, breakaway roping, heading, heeling, and steer stopping) reached \$1,525, with the largest total sum of \$333.75 going to Marcus Banister of Brighton, Colorado.

# Deworming Foals

Craig Reinemeyer, DVM, PhD, President, East Tennessee Clinical Research, Inc. (Rockwood, Tennessee) has studied parasites for many years. He says keeping foals dewormed is more complicated than deworming adult horses.

Ascarids (roundworms) grow up to 12 inches in length and are the most damaging parasite of foals because the larvae migrate through the lungs. If a foal is coughing, this may be an indication of ascarid infection.

Large numbers of adult worms can block the intestine. They lay eggs that pass out with manure. Eggs take 3 to 4 weeks to become infective larvae, and if eaten by a foal at that time the larvae begin migrating through the body. They go from the intestine into the bloodstream, then through the liver and lungs—where they are coughed up and swallowed, returning to the intestine to mature and lay eggs, to start the cycle again.

It is important to prevent pasture contamination, because the ascarid is very hardy and not as susceptible to adverse environmental conditions as other types of worms. “Once the pasture is contaminated with ascarids, you may have to deal with them for the next 10 or more years,” says Reinemeyer. Wherever there have been foals previously, the pasture may contain ascarids.

“Once the worms are out there, you can’t do anything about them. There is nothing you can apply to the pasture to kill them. In studies where people intentionally burned the pastures to try to get rid of the worms, it had no affect; pastures were still infective afterward. With foals and weanlings, it’s a lost battle if you allow a pasture or environment to become contaminated. Those worms are not just a pasture problem, however; they can also be transmitted in stalls or paddocks,” he says.

Ascarids are generally only found in foals and weanlings (most adults have developed immune resistance), so any areas on the farm where there have been young horses in earlier years could be contaminated. Foals usually don’t pick up ascarids from the feces of adult horses.

“It takes the ascarid about a month in the environment (after being passed in manure) to become infective. A foal could eat a large number of fresh eggs and not become infected. The eggs have to mature in the environment,” he says.

A farm that has never had foals would be a safer, cleaner environment for foals than a farm that’s been used for breeding/raising foals for many years. “Many foaling operations are defeating the purpose of deworming by doing it too frequently (in an effort to protect the foals), and as a result we are starting to see resistance to some of our deworming products. The ascarids are becoming resistant to ivermectin and moxidectin both,” he says. An integrated approach, using pasture management and deworming—to try to minimize pasture contamination—is most effective.

Dr. Julie Wilson, Stillwater, Minnesota, says it is important to monitor foals to make sure they are actually responding to the dewormer.

Veterinarians often recommend deworming the broodmare at foaling time. The tiny *Strongyloides westerii* that migrate into the udder and come through the milk into the foal can be a problem. “Many farms deworm the mare right after she foals, to block this migration. These worms can give the foal diarrhea,” says Wilson.

“Whether you deworm a mare at foaling may depend on the farm situation. If adults are on a good deworming program and you know you don’t have a *Strongyloides* problem, you might not need to deworm the mares at that point in time. But this is something horse breeders tend to forget, and a farm could get a buildup of these worms,” she says.

“You need to keep foals away from horses that are high shedders, if you can. And if you are showing foals, always think about where you let them graze when they are off your property,” she says. They may be eating grass that’s loaded with parasites.
