



- 1. Walk to B

- 10.At A break to a walk; exit pen





- 12. Walk
- 13. Stop and back
- 14. 360 degree turn each direction (either direction 1st) (L-R or R-L)



#### **Ranch Riding Pattern #1**




- 1. Walk
- 2. Trot
- 3. Extend the trot ,at the top of the arena, stop
- 4. 360 turn to the left
- 5. Left lead ½ circle, lope to the center
- 6. Change leads (simple or flying)
- 7. Right lead ½ circle
- 8. Extended lope up the long side of the arena (right lead)
- 9. Collect back to a lope around the top of the arena and back to center
- 10. Break down to an extended trot
- 11. Walk over poles
- 12. Stop and back




#### **Ranch Horse Reining Pattern #4**

129. Ranch Reining, W/T Youth 18 & Under 130. Ranch Reining, W/T Amateur



- 1. Beginning to the left, jog two circles to the left, the first circle small and slow, the next circle large and fast,
- 2. Complete two circles to the right, the first circle small and slow, the next circle large and fast.
- 3. Begin large circle to left, but do not close the circle, extend jog down the right side of the arena past center marker, and roll back right, no hesitation.
- 4. Continue around the end of the arena to extend jog down the left side of the arena past center marker and do a left roll back, no hesitation.
- 5. Extend jog past the middle marker, Stop, Back up 10 feet, 1/4 turn to right, 1/2 turn to left, 1/4 turn to Right. Hesitate to complete pattern.


131. Ranch Reining, Novice Rider All Ages 132 Ranch Reining, Youth 18 & Under

Trot to center of Arena, Stop. Start pattern facing towards Judge.

- 1. Beginning on the right lead Lope one circle to the right, Change Leads to the left.
- 2. Complete one circle to the left, Change leads to the right and go to the top of arena.
- 3. Run down center of arena past the end marker and come to stop.
- 4. Complete 1 1/2 spins to right
- 5. Run to the other end of the arena, past the end marker and come to a stop.
- 6. Complete 1 1/2 spins to the left. Run past the center marker, stop, back 10 feet.
- 7. Hesitate to complete pattern.

Trot to center of Arena, Stop. Start pattern facing towards Judge.

- 1. Beginning on the right lead complete two circle to the right, The first circle small and slow, the next circle large and fast, Change leads at the center of arena.
- 2. Complete two circles to the left, The first circle small and slow, the next circle large and fast, Change leads in the center of the arena.
- 3. Begin large circle to right, but do not close the circle. Run down center of arena past the end marker and do a right roll back, no hesitation.
- 4. Run up the middle to the other end of the arena past the end marker and do a left roll back, no hesitation.
- 5. Run past the center marker, stop, back 10 feet.
- 6. 1 spin to right, 1 spin to left. Hesitate to complete pattern.

#### Ranch Pleasure

The purpose of the ranch horse pleasure class is to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse should reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working ranch horse riding outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, relaxed, quiet, soft and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse can be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein without requiring undue restraint, but not shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the ranch pleasure horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as the quality of the movement are of primary considerations. The ideal Ranch pleasure horse should have a natural head carriage at each gait. Horses shall be shown individually. Markers shall be set up to designate gait changes.

Start to the left of in gate on the right track.




